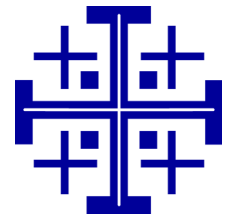

The First Lesson: Jonah 3:1-5, 10

The word of the Lord came to Jonah a second time, saying, "Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you." So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, "Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!" And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth.

When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it.

UPCOMING YOUTH CONFIRMATION CLASS FOR THOSE IN 7TH-12TH GRADES

Immanuel is scheduled for a **bishop's visitation and confirmation on Sunday, April 28th**. We are now forming a class for those youth who are interested in being confirmed. The Outline of Faith (the Catechism) that can be found in The Book of Common Prayer explains confirmation as "*the rite in which we express a mature commitment to Christ, and receive strength from the Holy Spirit through prayer and the laying on of hands by a bishop. It is required of those to be confirmed that they have been baptized, are sufficiently instructed in the Christian Faith, are penitent for their sins, and are ready to affirm their confession of Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord.*" (BCP pg. 860)

During our confirmation course, our youth will explore the Bible, the Book of Common Prayer, the Sacraments, Spiritual Practices, Church History, and practice sharing stories from their own faith journeys. Each class will begin with community building, and have interactive lessons to explore the topics mentioned above. We will end with a meal shared with our Episcopal Youth Community. The EYC will then meet until 7PM in the Parish Hall. Our first class will be February 4th at 4PM in Rev. Sarah's office. We will generally meet on the first and third Sundays of each month.

Separately, we will also invite any adults who wish to be confirmed or received into the Church to gather for their own preparation.
