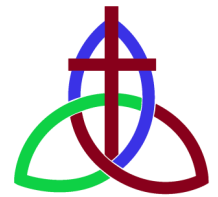

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. And one called to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory." 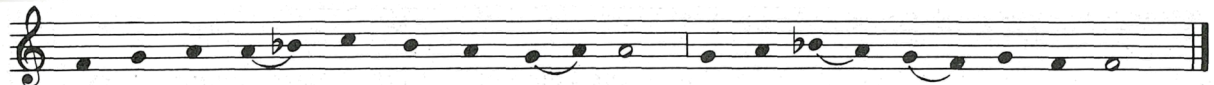

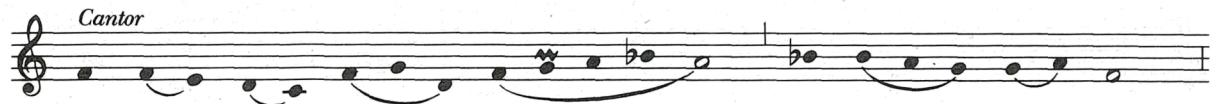

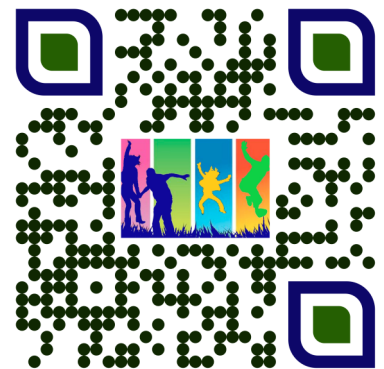
Dear families with school-aged children,

EAGLE SCOUT PROJECT UPDATES WILL RESTORE AND IMPROVE ZABRISKIE GROUNDS AND MEMORIAL GARDEN

We are grateful to the many volunteers and the Scout leadership for these innovative projects.

Nathan, whose project is the stone water mitigation path from the Fairchild patio down to the deck, and edging along the sidewalk, completed this project May 19. Parishoner Gerry Anderson was beneficiary representative for Nathan.

Jay proposed a wagon and Memorial Garden path restoration project and is in approval process. The two large wagons will be repainted and new wheels installed, and the contemplative path from the back of the Memorial Garden to the rear property line will have invasive plants removed, path restored, and bench repaired or replaced and is scheduled for completion this summer. Parishoner and Eagle Scout John Bednar is the beneficiary representative for Jay.

David's proposed project is restoration and improvement of the Hayes Memorial bench, seating area and shrubbery next to Fairchild patio and is currently in the planning stages. Brian Rush is beneficiary representative for David.

Virginia's Democratic and Republican Primary Election Day is June 18. Early Voting Started May 3.

Immanuel's Social Justice Committee Encourages All Registered Voters to Vote.

The three Democratic candidates for the Mayor's seat being vacated by two-term Mayor Justin Wilson are Amy Jackson, Alyia Gaskins, and Steven Peterson. There are 12 candidates for the six seats on the city council. Celianna Gunderson is running unopposed in the Republican primary. The 11 Democrats are: John Taylor Chapman, Canek Aguirre, Kirk McPike, Sarah Bagley, Jacinta Greene, Abdel Elnoubi, James Lewis Jr., Kevin Harris, Jesse O'Connell, Charlotte Scherer, and Jonathan Huskey. The first four of these are incumbent City Council members, and the next two are current School Board members.

Primary elections will be held in Arlington County and Fairfax County on the same day. The Arlington Democratic primary will choose a candidate for County Board, using ranked choice voting. Fairfax Democratic and Republican primaries will choose candidates for U.S. House of Representatives to represent the 10th District (incumbent: Jennifer Wexton) and the 11th District (incumbent: Gerry Connolly).

The Republican primary in all three jurisdictions will choose a candidate to run against incumbent U.S. Senator Tim Kaine. The five candidates are Hung Cao, Edward Garcia Jr., Jonathan Emord, C.L. Smith, and Scott Parkinson.

Election Day in each jurisdiction is June 18. Early voting began on May 3. The last day to register to vote or update existing registration by mail is May 28. Registered Virginians may vote in either primary, but not both. Be a good citizen, research the candidates, and cast your ballot!
